

Snowmobile Program Funding 101

Register your snowmobile and receive a <u>FREE</u> Sno-Park permit. Relax and enjoy this winter season without risk of a citation for not being registered or for not having a Sno-Park permit.

Your \$50 registration fee and money collected from a gas tax refund are put into a dedicated fund account for the Snowmobile Program.

The gas tax refund is computed using the following formula: 135 gallons (average yearly fuel usage per snowmobile) x .349 cents per gallon of gas x the annual number of registered snowmobiles and snowbikes.



The gas tax refund and registration fees collected each year add up to approximately \$94.20 per snowmobile or snowbike to fund the program. Fees collected this year are put towards next year's snowmobile season to pay for trail grooming, snow removal, sanitation, administration, education and enforcement.






The WSSA Rendezvous event in Winthrop was a resounding success, and the conditions on and above Hwy 20 did not disappoint even though the snow remained below the average.





Some more highlights from our season so far include the WSSA Rendezvous in Winthrop where we had the opportunity to meet so many great people from other clubs.




Sno-Jammers Snowmobile Club

The Cost of "Climate Friendly Technology"

The Hill reports, "The cost of the Inflation Reduction Act's energy and climate provisions is now expected to be significantly higher than previously projected, at least partially because of greater-than-anticipated investment in climate-friendly technology."

The story continued:

"The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) revised its projections this week, greatly increasing how much it believes the law's energy tax credit-related provisions will cost...

One of the factors the agency cited is a greater number of people expected to claim tax credits for electric vehicles, as proposed environmental regulations push the market in that direction and the Treasury Department issues flexible guidance for the credits.

turing and wind and solar power development."

In total, the CBO says the law's energy provisions will cost \$428 billion more than originally projected.





Timber Supply Shortage

Recently on Capitol Hill the American Forest Resource Council urged the Pacific Northwest's Congressional Delegation in Washington, DC to address challenges the region's forest and wood products sector that

supports more than 150,000 private sector jobs in Oregon and Washington.

This industry provides critical infrastructure for the Federal government to improve forest health, reduce wildfire risks on Federal lands, and help meet growing demand for carbon friendly wood products. Western Oregon has experienced the closure or curtailment of three



wood product mills since the beginning of the year, and additional closures and curtailments in the Pacific Northwest are likely to occur.

The common thread is a diminishing timber supply to the region's wood products manufacturers.

The three Western Oregon mills that announced closures or curtailments purchase and rely on public timber to operate and sustain workforces. Killed labor is gone. They don't come back.

Meanwhile, lumber prices have slowly been inching up.

EVs

Hertz CEO resigns after EV push goes bust. Hertz, one of the four largest car rental companies in the world, is replacing its CEO after the company reversed its bet on electric vehicle (EV) rentals over increasing costs.

Scherr's resignation comes as the car rental company struggles with the higher repair costs and low demand for EV rentals.

In January, Hertz announced in financial filings that it had made the 'strategic decision' to sell approximately 20,000 EVs from its U.S. fleet, or about one-third of its global EV fleet, and to instead invest in gaspowered cars.

Polaris Government and Defense Launches New 2025 Military Snowmobiles

Two new military snowmobiles have been launched from Polaris Government and Defense: the 2025 Military 650 Titan 155, and 2025 Military 850 Pro RMK 155, built off the industry-leading technology and rideenhancing upgrades of the 2025 Polaris Snowmobile lineup.

Warfighters worldwide rely on Polaris Government and Defense to provide off-road, light tactical vehicles for the most austere conditions. Polaris militarized snowmobiles, or over-snow reconnaissance vehicles (OSRVs), are a critical component of the off-road arsenal for winter warfare.

Jason Goldstein moving to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Many of you know Jason from the State Parks Winter Recreation Program. He has been in the #2 positions for many years. Jason has worked hard for the Program and is the reason we have georeferenced PDF trail maps to use in apps like Avenza. (He is actually the person who put me on to Avenza, a free app I still use when playing in the mountains.) Jason is also whiz with a drone, and you can see his work on the sno-parks pages where he has aerial pics of most of the sno-parks in the state. Jason also has a YouTube channel with some great videos showing off the outdoors in the Pacific Northwest and beyond. (His channel is PNW Xplored.) And did I mention he is a snowbiker? He bought one a couple of seasons ago. Good luck with your new role with the DNR Jason!

Avalanche death in our backyard. Sadly, in early March, there was an avalanche fatality in the Ahtanum, west of Yakima. While I didn't personally know the victim, a couple of my riding friends did. Reports indicate the pair riding together weren't prepared for an avalanche or avalanche recovery. The person caught was buried about four-feet under, which would have been a tough save for a single rescuer. I'm not aware of an avalanche death in our area in the 22 years I've lived here, but it just shows it can happen anywhere. And if you study the terrain in the Ahtanum, it isn't hard to see we've been pretty

lucky. There are a lot of bowls with differing orientations and varying degrees of steepness. It's important to check the avalanche forecasts before every ride and understand it. Avoid avalanche terrain whenever possible. And if you are playing on the hills, remember one-at-a -time, don't go up to help you stuck buddy, and don't congregate below in the potential runout zone. The Northwest Avalanche Center (NWAC) has a report on this accident which can be viewed here: https://files.nwac.us/wp-content/ uploads/2024/03/24094533/Final-20240301-Darland-Mt.docx.pdf

Snowboarder fell through cornice on St. **Helens; died.** There is a report pending on this incident on the NWAC page. Reports on the news indicate a cornice gave way and the victim fell 1,200 feet. On the NWAC site, there is mention of an avalanche being triggered from the cornice breaking away. At this time I'm not sure if the

person died from the fall, or from getting buried in the avalanche. But regardless, STAY AWAY FROM THE EDGE until you can determine if there is solid earth underneath you!

Three snowbikers dead after avalanche in Ouebec's Chic-Choc Mountains. I'm not trying to be danger-focused in this edition of Matt's Misc., but I found this article interesting. The

reason is because people living in the East think avalanches are only a problem out West. To be fair, I didn't even know Quebec HAD mountains! Or snowbikers! In this event, there were four riders and three were caught, buried and died. The one survivor was actually off to the side, videoing. (I didn't see any reports indicating there is video of the avalanche occurring though.) Quebec does have an avalanche forecasting cen-

ter, although it appears this area isn't directly covered. Conditions were considered 'moderate' in the region. While there was no mention of avalanche gear being carried, I think it is safe to assume there were no transceivers or probes with the riders.

Boy killed while parking snowmobile in family's Maine garage.

This is just heartbreaking. An 11-year-old boy crashed a snowmobile and was killed while attempting to park in his family's garage. The boy, who was not wearing a helmet, sped across a field and crashed into a corner of the garage. Emergency medical technicians attempted life-saving measures, but the boy was pronounced dead. Just a dumb accident. Parents: caution you to keep your kids on appropriately sized/ powered machines. I



cringe every time I see little kids riding bigger machines. Contrary to what you believe, they don't have the skills and experience you think they do. Don't let this happen to your family.

Tracked Tesla Cybertruck! If you have ever seen Heavy D Sparks and SparksMotors on You-Tube, you probably aren't surprised his crew has already 'tracked' one. It's still a work in progress



and there have been many parts broken, modified and replaced to get it to where it is. While not legal on the trails here in WA, it is a cool ride for sure! Check out the video here: https:// www.voutube.com/watch? v=6BfQ0yW0pk8&t=277s


